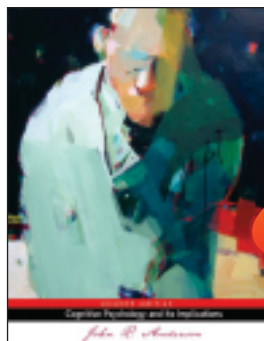
About the Book
